Note 1: We believe John Douglass, his wife Nancy [Douglass], and their children are reasonably correct as shown below. Most of the information concerning them (except for that concerning their son Samuel) came to us July 2002 from the "Genealogy of Mary Kerr" on <RootsWeb.com>.

Unfortunately, the information is minimal and Mary Kerr's sources are not given. We have been unsuccessful in contacting her, and have not yet found alternative sources. We include the information here because it seems reasonable, and hope it may help a future researcher find confirmation and/or additional information. Please be aware that our research concerning pages 6c-1 and 6c-2 is incomplete and should not be considered conclusive.

Note 2: For Christmas 1866, Annie Rebecca Badger (great-grandmother of BFE) received an album in which she kept remembrances. The book, in possession (1992) of cousin Edith Duke Kautsky, was signed by many of Annie Rebecca's relatives and friends, some of whom we have been able to identify and include in this Section 6c.

Note 3: Unless otherwise annotated, we've extracted the information on page 6c-3 and following pages from Annie Rebecca's book, extensive notes of Edith Cole Fisher (ECF), notes of Ellen C Badger, letters from Claire Cole Fisher, notes of Judy Douglas Overstreet, notes of Nancy J Wells (including photocopies of pages from the Douglass family bible), and United States Census records of 1860, 1880, 1920 and 1930.

Note 4: Ancestors of BFE (Barbara Ann Fisher) are underlined.

I. John¹ Douglass, believed to have been born 1765-1775 in Ireland, married Nancy [Douglass]; nine children. She is also believed to have been born 1765-1775 in Ireland. We don't know where in Ireland they were born, or when they came to America. We'd like to know more about them. John died 14 Nov 1825, age 50-60.

A. Michael² Douglass, born 8 Nov 1790, married Barbara **Shearer** -- see page 6c-2.

B. Elizabeth² Douglass was born 16 Nov 1792.

C. John² Douglass was born 7 Nov 1794.

D. Martha² Douglass was born 11 Mar 1796.

E. Robert² Douglass, born 7 Sep 1799, married Janet **Boyd**. Born 23 Sep 1793, she died 24 Jun 1809, age 15, when he was only 9½ years old. *Note: obviously something is wrong with the dates shown.*

Regardless of the concerns raised by the dates shown, an item of note is the number of younger generation members of the Douglass and Badger families who were given the name Boyd as a first or middle name. Was Janet an exceptionally remarkable person? Or was this because the Boyd family, perhaps neighbors, was held in special esteem by the Douglass family? Had there been there a Boyd connection in earlier generations?

F. Samuel² Douglass, born 1 Jan 1802, married Rebecca Anne Cannon -- see page 6c-3.

G. Mary² Douglass was born 30 Mar 1807.

We assume Mary and her sister Nancy were twins.

H. Nancy² Douglass was born 30 Mar 1807.

I. James² Douglass was born 14 Jun 1809.

MICHAEL DOUGLASS (b 1790) and BARBARA SHEARER (b 1793) and their descendants

Michael's parents were John Douglass and Nancy [Douglass]
Barbara's parents were Jacob Shearer and Elizabeth Hindgarnter

A. Michael² Douglass, born 8 Nov 1790, possibly in Ireland, married Barbara **Shearer**, eleven children. Her parents were Jacob Shearer and Elizabeth **Hindgarnter**. Michael died 28 Feb 1861, age 70. Born 23 Sep 1793, Barbara died 22 Apr 1880, age 86.

1. John Washington³ **Douglass**, born 19 Sep 1818, married Mary [Douglass]. He died 2 Feb 1880, age 61.
2. Elizabeth Jane³ **Douglass**, born 5 May 1820, married William **Hoon**. She died 20 May 1885, age 65.
3. Polly³ **Douglass** was born 10 Aug 1821.
4. George Jacob³ **Douglass** was born 12 Mar 1822. He died 17 Apr 1893, age 71.
5. William Johnston³ **Douglass**, born 20 Dec 1823, married Sarah [Douglass]. He died 5 Mar 1901, age 77.
6. Martha Belinda³ **Douglass** was born 29 Dec 1825. She died 27 Feb 1906, age 80.
7. Charlotte Angeline³ **Douglass** was born 24 May 1828. She died 17 Dec 1918, age 90.
8. Sherburne Williams³ **Douglass** was born 18 Aug 1830. He died 7 Jun 1897, age 66.
9. Henry Edward³ **Douglass** was born 10 Dec 1833.
10. Amelia Maria³ **Douglass**, born 19 May 1835, married John **Pearce**. Born 26 Mar 1831, he died 2 May 1893, age 62. Amelia Maria died about 1919, age about 84.
 - a. Walter Douglas⁴ **Pearce**, born 7 Jun 1859, married Mary Louise **Ziegler** and had children. He died Jul 1943, age about 84.
 - b. Anna L⁴ **Pearce** was born 1 May 1861.
 - c. William A⁴ **Pearce**, born 18 Jan 1865, married Jessie M **Ash** and had children.
11. Daniel³ **Douglass** was born 13 Sep 1836.

SAMUEL DOUGLASS (b 1802) and REBECCA ANNE CANNON (b 1805) and their descendants

Samuel's parents were John Douglass and Nancy [Douglass]
 Rebecca's parents are not known to us

F. Samuel² Douglass was born 1 Jan 1812, probably near Uniontown, Fayette Co PA. He married **Rebecca Anne Cannon** 15 Sep 1825¹² near Uniontown; ten children, the first three born in PA and the others in Ohio.

He died 30 Dec 1878, age almost 77. Born 17 Jan 1805, she died 18 Mar 1883, age 78. They were buried Section 6, Bellefontaine Cemetery, Lake Twp, Logan Co OH.¹

They moved to Ohio near Bellefontaine, Logan Co, in 1831 or 1832, and "built a large log house with the help of many men and boys from around the countryside. There was a parlor downstairs, with a carpet on the floor and lace curtains at the windows". Some of Samuel's brothers and sisters remained in Pennsylvania, northwest of Pittsburgh (Rochester, Beaver Falls, etc). He and Rebecca had 12 children, but we have only 10 names and know very little about most of them. ECF's notes say she thinks the two others died in infancy.

The first entry for Samuel in the Logan Co land records was when he bought 156.54 acres⁸ (northwest corner of Section 1, Twp 2, Range 15) between the Miami Rivers in Harrison Twp, for which he paid \$547.89.

On 16 Oct 1866, Samuel and his partner James D McCormick bought the Kingston Mill at what is now known as King's Creek, Champaign Co OH, from Mathew Mason for \$9,000.00, 2/3 by Samuel and 1/3 by McCormick. In Jan 1868, Samuel bought out his partner's one-third share in the mill, and then sold the mill to his son James B Douglass and his son-in-law Joseph E Carr. That same year, James sold his equal undivided half of the mill to Joseph. Family tradition has it that they lost money in the business venture of the mill so they sold out, and returned to Logan Co to live.

Records of the Bellefontaine Presbyterian Church show that Samuel Douglass and Rebecca Douglass, "daughter of Mr Cannon of Fayette Co PA", joined that church "by examination" 17 Dec 1851.⁷ Of course we are pleased to know when they joined the church, but deeply wish Rebecca's father's name had been complete!

Records of the Bellefontaine Presbyterian Church indicate that Samuel Douglass and Rebecca Douglass transferred to Kingston (now King's Creek), Champaign Co OH 10 Jan 1869.⁸

Later, after they retired from farming, they lived with their youngest daughter, Lucinda, and her husband, John Musselman, in Harper, Rushcreek Twp, Logan Co OH.⁸

In May 2002 we were very pleased to find the gravestone of Samuel and Rebecca, beautiful pink granite in perfect condition. Earlier we thought Samuel's surname might be spelled Douglas, because ECF spelled it that way, but "Douglass" is on the stone and is handwritten on some family bible pages.⁵

1. **Eliza Jane³ Douglass**, born 25 May 1827 in PA, married **John Calvin Badger** -- see page 6c-5.
2. **Ann³ Douglass**, born 16 Jul 1829 in PA, married **Elisha Reams** 9 Mar 1854, with Rev John A Meeks officiating. Probably at least one son.
3. **Nancy³ Douglass**, born 4 Aug 1831, probably in PA, married **Joseph E Carr** -- see page 6c-8.
4. **Mary³ Douglass**, born 8 Sep 1834 in OH, married **Jacob Mohr** 8 Sep 1854; at least four children. He was born 7 Nov 1826 in PA. His parents were Conrad Mohr and Anna **Ischermann**.
 In 1850 Jacob was a cabinet maker living Bellefontaine. In 1880 Mary and Jacob, shown as a farmer, were living Harrison Twp, Logan Co OH.

ECF said Mary and Jake lived on Mary's parents' home place near Bellefontaine OH. This may have been after her parents had gone to live with her sister Lucinda, but it's possible they lived there earlier.

- a. Laura⁴ **Mohr** married Henry **Coleman**.
- b. Mary (Carrie?) Lou⁴ **Mohr**, usually known as Lou, married Daniel "Dan" **Sullivan**.
- c. Samuel Edgar⁴ "Ed" **Mohr**, born 2 Aug 1859, was a farm helper, age 20, in 1880. He married Addie May **Newell**. Her parents were Hugh Newell and Mary **Miller**.
- d. George Boyd⁴ **Mohr** died in infancy. We don't know when he was born.

5. Martha³ **Douglass**, born 2 Jan 1837, married Samuel Ewing **Stanfield** -- [see page 6c-9](#).

6. John Cannon³ **Douglass**, born 6 Jan 1839, married Martha C **Brown** -- [see page 6c-12](#).

7. James Boyd³ **Douglass**, born 22 Aug 1841, married Barbara **Miller** 4 Jan 1866. Her parents were Jacob Miller and Diana **Huber**. Tragically, Barbara died 27 Mar 1866, less than three months after her marriage.

Secondly, James married Mary (Mary Jane?) **Rice**. In the 1880 census of Lynn, Hardin Co OH, James' family included Mary J Douglass, wife, age 33, and Mary Rice, age 59, identified as "MotherL".

THE MILLER FAMILY -- Jacob Miller married Diana Huber about 1833; seven children. His parents were Martin Miller and Esther **Bowman**.

Born 1805, Diana died 1880, age about 75. We wonder if she could be connected with the Huber family mentioned on page 6c-8, but haven't been able to identify her parents.

- a. Miller⁴ **Douglass**.

We don't know when Miller was born but, based on his first name, we wonder if Barbara Miller may have been his mother. We didn't find him in the 1880 census, and don't know whether he died young, or perhaps was away when the census was taken.

8. Ellen³ **Douglass** was born 11 Mar 1844. She may have married (--?--) **Parish** and had son William, who died early 1948.

9. Lucinda Maria³ **Douglass**, born 6 May 1846, married John A **Musselman** 14 Mar 1867; at least three children. He was born about 1842 in OH. Lucinda's parents, Samuel Douglass and Rebecca Anne Cannon, lived with Lucinda and John in Harper, Rushcreek Twp, Logan Co OH, after Samuel and Rebecca had retired from farming.

In the 1880 census of Rushcreek Twp, Logan Co OH, Rebecca Anne Cannon is shown as mother-in-law, 75-year-old widow (Samuel had died 1878).

Also with John and Lucinda were John's mother, Elizabeth D Musselman, 56-year-old widow born in KY, and Rebecca **Sutton**, age 85, grandmother born in KY. We think she may be Elizabeth's mother.

Elmer Sutton, age 17, is listed as "other"; we don't know the relationship, if any.

- a. Icic⁴ **Musselman**.
- b. Lucian D⁴ **Musselman** was born about 1874 (age 6 in 1880 census).
- c. Pearl O⁴ **Musselman** was born about 1880 (age 2/12 in 1880 census).

10. Samuel L (Luther?) Ewing² "Lute" **Douglass** was born 22 Jun 1848.

ELIZA JANE DOUGLASS (b 1827) and JOHN CALVIN BADGER (b 1821)

Eliza Jane's parents were Samuel Douglass and Rebecca Anne Cannon
 John Calvin's parents were (--?--) Badger and Rachel Ford

We remember being visited at Indiana University, probably in 1952, by some of the Badgers. Although we weren't quite sure, at that time, what their relationship to us might be, we were pleased to meet them. We now think they must have been Robert Badger, page 6c-10, and/or his family. They were very nice people and so kind to come to see us.

1. Eliza Jane³ **Douglass**, born 25 May 1827 near Uniontown PA, married John Calvin Badger 27 Oct 1846 near Columbus OH; seven children. In 1850, they were living McArthur Twp, Logan Co OH. His parents were (--?--) **Badger**, a minister, and **Rachel Ford**.

Born 16 May 1821 near Lancaster OH, John died 8 Jul 1864, age 43, from illness contracted while on duty at Bermuda Hundred Neck VA. He was in Co C, 132 Reg OVI, and was buried Hampton Military Cemetery, Hampton VA. Eliza later married Peter **Flemming**; one child.

GIRLHOOD -- There is an amusing little story about something that happened when Eliza was a girl. They were having a house party and the girls were upstairs, with the boys in a room below. In those days, people often had a rather small round hole, in the floor of an upper room, to let the heat ascend to the room above.

The girls were having fun, when one girl stepped in the hole. That let a long white leg suddenly appear from the ceiling in the room where the boys were.

(ECF said in her notes that, in Eliza's days, women had toes. In Annie Rebecca Badger's days, women had feet. In ECF's own days, women had ankles. She remarks that, in 1953, women and girls have 'most all.)

When the girls and boys got together, nothing was said about the spectacular leg. The unfortunate girl would not let on that she was lame or strained in any way. The boys watched carefully. ECF remarks that, in 1953, it would cause no embarrassment. They would just be sorry the girl was strained, if any attention at all was paid.

WEDDING DRESS -- When Eliza Jane Douglass married John Calvin Badger in 1846, her dress was thin fine white cotton or linen, hand embroidered all over in small bouquets. She and her sister each embroidered and made their dresses, with full skirts sewed on tight waistbands, and long full sleeves. Eliza was 19, which was considered old to be unmarried. "Some thought she would be an 'old maid', then she married the handsomest man around!"

HOME LIFE -- When canning food in tin cans was introduced, the neighbors were there to watch the new procedure. They had always preserved what food they could by drying; this was such an innovation. They were afraid the cans would explode and left when Eliza started to put the tin lids on the cans. She held the lids down tightly, while she poured the hot sealing wax on the edges of the lids to seal them. They were held down by a weight until cool.

Eliza had another new invention and did not have to cook at the fireplace. She had a cookstove.

The farm home of Eliza and John, about four miles from Bellefontaine OH, was beautiful. It was called Willowdale or Willowvale. All seven of their children were born there. We wish we knew where it was.

THE BADGER FAMILY -- ECF said Rachel Ford was the daughter of "slave holders in Virginia". When Rachel was very young she married a neighbor boy, (Andy?) **Stiarwalt**, and her parents disinherited her. She did not know how to do anything, even dress herself. Her first husband did not live long, and she married, secondly, (--?--) **Deardorf**.

Her only child, as far as we know, was John Calvin Badger. We don't know anything else about Rachel, names of her parents, when or where she was born or died or was buried, or anything about her first and second husbands, even whether we have spelled their names correctly. We would very much like to find out more about her.

We have also been unsuccessful in finding anything, even the first name, of John Calvin Badger's father. We don't know when or where he was born or died or was buried, or whether he had earlier marriages and possibly other children. All we know is that ECF said he was a minister.

JOHN'S MILITARY SERVICE -- In early 1864, the US Government decided more troops were urgently needed to help support the regular army's siege of Petersburg, and one of the steps taken was to recruit (conscript seems more likely) troops to serve a limited term.

John was one of those who became what were known as "hundred day men". He was enlisted into the 38th Ohio National Guard, from Logan Co, as a private 2 May 1864. This unit, with other National Guard units, was organized 15 May 1864 into the 132nd Regiment Ohio Infantry at Camp Chase OH, and John was in E Company.

The regiment left 22 May and marched to Columbus OH, then went by rail to Washington DC, arriving 14 May, and camped near Fort Albany VA. This was an earthwork bastion, close to where the intersection of Arlington Ridge Road and Nash Street in Arlington now are, a short distance southwest from the present day Pentagon Building. The fort was obliterated during the construction of Shirley Highway, but there is a historical marker nearby.

The 132nd embarked on the steamer *John Brooks* 30 May, and went to White House, New Kent Co VA, on the Pamunkey River. The regiment performed fatigue and picket duty there until 11 Jun, when it embarked on another steamer and went to Bermuda Hundred, Chesterfield Co VA, on the James River. Also called Bermuda Hundred Neck, it is a swampy area north of Hopewell VA, southeast of Richmond and northeast of Petersburg.

On 12 Aug the regiment departed for Norfolk and stayed there until 27 Aug, when it started back to Columbus. It was mustered out 19 Sep 1864 Camp Chase OH, having lost no officers, 2 enlisted men killed or mortally wounded, and 45 enlisted men due to disease, accidents, etc, out of 846 total.

WHAT HAPPENED TO JOHN -- Many soldiers became ill from miserable conditions in the Bermuda Hundred Neck, and John Calvin Badger was one of them. About 20 Jun 1864 at Hatcher's Station VA, due to exposure, he became ill with typhoid fever and rheumatism. A general decline became apparent, growing worse, and he was sent to hospital at Point of Rocks VA

On 8 Jul 1864, he died on board the steamer *Thomas A Morgan* on its way to Fortress Monroe. He was buried Hampton National Cemetery, Hampton City VA, across Hampton Roads from Norfolk VA.⁹ This cemetery is at the intersection of Cemetery Road and Marshall Avenue in Hampton VA, on the grounds of Hampton University.

ECF's notes said that John was buried Arlington National Cemetery, but when BFE went across the Potomac to see, she learned that he wasn't buried in Arlington at all.

We realized more research was needed, and our son Karl Frederick "Fritz" Edler III was successful in finding John's burial place through a website on the Internet. Much more information is available about the regiment, and the period in which John was involved, a very interesting time in the history of that war.⁹

We think it is so sad that people do not know where their relatives are buried, and we doubt his grave was ever visited by any of his descendents until we did so recently. We (Fritz, KFE and BFE) were, fortunately, able to go 27 Jan 2003, and we paid our respects on behalf of all readers of *All-People*. It is a nicely kept place, flat with a few trees, surrounded by a stone wall. It is apparently mostly full, with gravestones from various wars.

On the trip we visited White House and Bermuda Hundred Neck, where John had been. We also visited City Point, across the river from Bermuda Hundred. (That property belonged originally to the Eppes family, Section 2.)

ELIZA'S LATER YEARS -- When her husband died in the summer of 1864, Eliza was left with seven children, the youngest a tiny infant. It would have been necessary for her to marry again before very many years passed.

She married Peter Flemming 29 Sep 1868 Fort Madison IA. On 18 Mar 1869 the family was living Nauvoo, Hancock Co IL. Eliza's daughter Annie Rebecca was married 29 Jul 1869 Fort Madison, Lee Co IA. John Cole Flemming, son of Eliza and Peter, was born about 1870 in IL.

In 1880 Eliza and Peter were living Carrollton, Carroll Co MO, next door to Eliza's daughter Annie Rebecca and her family. In 1880, the household of Peter Flemming (a carpenter age 54, born New Brunswick of parents born Scotland), included Eliza, Jenny B (a school teacher age 21), Ivaloo (age 16), and John (age 10).

In 1882, Eliza was still living Carrollton MO and helped with the preparations for the wedding of her daughter Jennie. In 1889 her youngest daughter Ivaloo was married in Lincoln NE, and John Cole Flemming was best man, but this does not necessarily mean Eliza was living there.

We don't know when or where Peter Flemming died or was buried.

ECF said Eliza came from Boone IA, on 24 Dec 1901, to visit her and her family at 1651 D Ave, Cedar Rapids IA, and that Aunt Iva Trenchard came 3 Mar 1902, also from Boone IA. We think this is an indication that, in her later years, Eliza lived with Iva and her family. We don't know when or where Eliza died, or where she is buried.

The only other things we have about Eliza Jane, herself, are two poems she wrote. One of them, written in 1896, is in praise of her baby great-grandson Douglas Spencer Fisher, and below is the other one, undated:

*"Farewell to you, my new made friends.
From you I'm loath to part,
For by some magic spell you've found
A lodgement in my heart."*

-- Children of Eliza Jane Douglass and John Calvin Badger --

a. Samuel Douglass⁴ **Badger**, born about 1848 (12 in 1860 census), married Arethusa "Thusa" **Billingsley**; at least three children. A Baptist minister, he died Monday 13 Mar 1899 at home, Superior NE,³ age about 52. Secondly, Thusa married (--?--) **Booth**.

ECF said that Samuel spoke and understood seven languages. She also said that Thusa was "lively and witty and darling" at age 84, and lived to be almost 88.

i. Edith Mary⁵ **Badger** married (--?--) **Rogers**; no children.

ii. Charlene⁵ **Badger** married Alva **Karraker**; at least two sons: James K Karraker and (--?--) Karraker, who was called "Brother". Alva was a WWI veteran.

iii. Carroll⁵ **Badger** married but had no children. He was a professor at Agricultural Experimental Workstation at University of IL for many years.

b. Annie Rebecca⁴ **Badger**, born 7 Jan 1849, married John Wesley Cole -- see page 6c-13.

c. Walter Ambrose⁴ **Badger**, born 2 Jan 1851, married Emma Annabelle **Pool** -- see page 6c-14.

d. Cornelia Josephine⁴ "Nelia" **Badger**, born 11 Apr 1853 near Bellefontaine OH, married William T **Rairdon**. She probably died before 1890, age less than 37. William married Laura M [Rairdon] 1890.

Seven children in first marriage: Warner; Earnest; Bertha; Boyd; Mabel; Loyd; and Johnnie (who may have married Celia [Rairdon]). Three children in second marriage: Roswell R, Vera, and Irene.

Nelia and William lived on a farm called Maple Grove, at Dawn MO, about a day's drive (25 miles) from Carrollton. We aren't sure of the birth order of their children, but note the Welsh spelling of Loyd.

ECF and their son Johnnie liked to climb the steps of a windmill there, a dangerous thing to do. The farm was in cyclone territory. Once ECF and her mother Annie were there during a cyclone. They all went to the cyclone cellar, but the cyclone lifted before it reached them. ECF said it looked like a high, wide, dark blue great curtain sweeping over the prairie.

e. Oscar Eugene⁴ **Badger**, born 29 May 1855, married Jennie **Miller** -- see page 6c-16.

f. Eliza Jane⁴ "Jennie" **Badger**, born 17 May 1859, married James Wesley **Poland** -- see page 6c-17.

g. Edith Ivaloo⁴ "Iva" **Badger**, born 16 Mar 1864, married William H **Trenchard** -- see page 6c-18.

-- Child of Eliza Jane Douglass [Badger] and Peter Flemming --

h. John Cole⁴ **Flemming**, probably born about 1870 (age 10 in 1880), married Celia [Flemming]; no children known to us.

We don't know anything about John, except that he was best man at the wedding of his half-sister Ivaloo on 1 Jan 1889, when he would have been about 18.

Joseph's parents were Daniel Carr and Mary Minnich

3. Nancy³ **Douglass**, born 4 Aug 1831, married Joseph E **Carr** 27 Oct 1852; at least nine children over a period of 21 years. He was born about 1827 in VA (age 53 in 1880 census). His parents were Daniel Carr and Mary **Minnich**, both born in VA. In 1850 Joseph was a farmer in the Douglass household. In 1860 and 1880 he and Nancy were living Harrison Twp, Logan Co OH. She died 15 Feb 1895, age 63.

a. Josephine⁴ **Carr** was born about 1852 (age 8 in 1860).

b. Samuel Cole⁴ **Carr**, born about 1854 (age 6 in 1860, age 26 in 1880), married Margaret [Carr]; son Frazier. She was born about 1855 (age 65 in 1920). In 1920 Samuel and Margaret were living Hardin Co OH, with Frazier, age 36, in their household.

c. Mary⁴ **Carr** was born about 1856 (age 4 in 1860).

d. Ellen (Etta?) M⁴ **Carr**, born about 1858 (age 2 in 1860, 22 in 1880), married (--?--) **Carl**.

f. Lucy Moria⁴ **Carr**, born 6 Feb 1864 Harrison, Logan Co, married Abraham Huber "Abe" **Moore**; nine children.¹¹ He was born 2 Feb 1861. His parents were Raphael Rapier Moore, born in OH, and Margaret **Huber**, born in VA. Abe died 27 Sep 1941, age 80. Lucy died 3 Mar 1953, age 89. They were buried Huber Cemetery, Pleasant Twp, Logan Co OH.

i. Gail Howard⁵ **Moore** was born 23 Dec 1882. She died 20 Sep 1899, age 16.

ii. Helen Ivaloo⁵ **Moore**, born 20 Mar 1887, married (--?--) **Frantz** of DeGraff OH; no children.

iii. Frances Willard⁵ **Moore**, born 12 Jun 1888, married Dr (--?--) **Elzy** of Columbus OH; no children.

iv. Paul Herman⁵ **Moore**, born 26 Aug 1890, was a physician. He married and had a son.

v. Raphael Rapier⁵ **Moore** was born 5 Aug 1894.

vi. Mary⁵ **Moore**, born 27 Dec 1896, married Dan W **Wolfe** of DeGraff OH.

vii. Eva Pearl⁵ **Moore**, born 16 Jan 1900, married David **Schrader** of Masillon OH; three or four children.

viii. Dwight Douglass⁵ **Moore** was born 2 Nov 1902. He lived in OK and had daughter Haven.

ix. Antoinette Eloise⁵ **Moore**, born 11 Jul 1909, married William M "Billie" **Strayer** of DeGraff 9 Oct 1934 Hamilton Co OH; daughter Nancy. They lived Cincinnati OH.

5. Martha³ **Douglass**, born 2 Jan 1837 Logan Co OH, married Samuel Ewing **Stanfield** "11th month, 9th day" 1853 Logan Co; seven or nine children. He was a farmer near Harper, Rushcreek Twp, Logan Co. A Quaker, he was born "11th month, 23rd day" 1832 Logan Co. His parents were Thomas Stanfield Jr and Margaret **Reames**. Samuel died 11 Jun 1898 Rushcreek Twp, age 65. Martha died 7 Dec 1906, age 69. They were buried Equality Cemetery, on County Road 50 east of Rushsylvania, Logan Co.

Samuel was a Quaker but was "put out of unity" because of his marriage to Martha, who wasn't a Quaker. He became a member of the Methodist Episcopal church.

THE STANFIELD FAMILY -- Thomas Stanfield Jr was born Greene Co TN. His father, Thomas Stanfield Sr, was born Newcastle Co DE. He came to OH about 1805, the first settler in Rushcreek Twp.

Margaret Reames was born Jack Swamp, Northhampton Co NC. She died 14 Apr 1859, buried Stanfield Pioneer Cemetery. Her parents were William Reames (born 28 Dec 1768) and Naomi **Vaughn**. His parents were Jeremiah Reames and Margaret **Merrimoon**. Naomi's father was John Vaughn.

THE STANFIELD PIONEER CEMETERY is on Co Rt 9 northeast from Bellefontaine about four miles. It marks the location of a Quaker Meeting House built before 1820. William Reames was a soldier in the Revolutionary War. He and Thomas Stanfield Sr were promoters and members of the Quaker society which became the Goshen Monthly Meeting, with their Meeting House on the Stanfield farm. It was also the site of the first Quaker school in the township, and later became the first public school.

We are grateful to Nancy J Wells of Ohio for most of our information on the family of Martha Douglass and Samuel Stanfield. Nancy cites cemetery, marriage and other records in Logan Co OH.⁶

- c.** Franklin E⁴ "Frank" **Stanfield**, born 1 Jul 1859, married Bell (Clara) **Kautzman**; at least two children. She was born May 1867.
 - i.** Edith⁵ **Stanfield** was born 21 Jul 1888 Logan Co.
 - ii.** Mildred⁵ **Stanfield** was born 25 Jul 1890 Logan Co.

d. Sarah Rebecca⁴ **Stanfield** was born 4 Jan 1864. Never married, she died 13 May 1939 near Rushsylvania, Logan Co, age 75. She was buried Equality Cemetery, Rushsylvania.

e. Samuel Ewing⁴ **Stanfield**, born 27 Sep 1869, died 19 Jul 1876, age 6, buried Stanfield Pioneer Cemetery.

f. Charles Oscar⁴ **Stanfield** was born 3 Sep 1874 Harper, Rushcreek Twp, Logan Co. He and Lula Maude “Maud” **Starbuck** had a child 30 Jan 1893. She was born 20 Aug 1877 Kenton, Hardin Co OH. Her parents were Joseph D Starbuck Jr and Amanda **Predmore**.

Maud married Orva **Davis** later in 1893; two sons: Claude and Charley. She died of consumption 25 May 1902, age 24.

Charles married Clara Salome **Duerr** 7 Oct 1902; ten children. She was born 12 Aug 1885 Hamilton Co OH. Her parents were Joseph Francis Duerr Sr and Elizabeth "Lizzie" Frances **Gluhm**.

Charles died 19 Apr 1951, Rushsylvania, Logan Co OH, age 76. Clara died 7 Jun 1956, age 70. They were buried Rushsylvania Cemetery.

When Charles was 13, he was injured in an accident when the floor of a hall used for a school exhibition gave way, killing three persons and injuring 25. He became a railroad telegraph operator at Middletown OH before returning to the home farm in 1916.

i. Orpha⁵ **Stanfield**, born 30 Jan 1893, was known as Flossie **Starbuck**.

She married Samuel Marion **Jones** 24 Dec 1909 Logan Co OH; five children. He was born 25 Jun 1882 Pendleton KY, son of George Washington Jones and Mary Elizabeth **Blackburn**. A month before the youngest child was due, Samuel died 20 May 1917, age 34, buried Bellefontaine Cemetery, Bellefontaine, Logan Co OH.

Orpha/Flossie later married William **Cobb**. She died 18 Oct 1974 Los Angeles CA, age 81.

Flossie lived with her mother and stepfather until her mother died, and then lived with her Starbuck grandparents. Her parentage was always kept a secret.

ii. Douglas Robert⁵ **Stanfield** was born 26 Nov 1903 Middletown, Butler Co. He married Marian Ruth **Loren** (born 26 Mar 1904, daughter of John W Loren and Mary Rebecca **Vaughn**). Douglas worked in education and became executive secretary of the Ohio Farm Bureau. He died 26 Jan 1970 Columbus OH, age 66. Marian died 26 Dec 1996 Franklin Co OH, age 92. They were buried Westerville Cemetery, Franklin Co.

Two children: Mary Rebecca (married Max **Lineberger**) and Ruth Ann (married Richard **Thomas**).

iii. John Martin⁵ **Stanfield**, born 15 Jun 1907 near Middletown, Butler Co OH, married Sarah Elizabeth "Betty" **Given** in 1935; three children. She was born 24 Feb 1915. Her parents were Walter M Given and Kathryn E **Nosker**. John was teacher and principal in Rushsylvania schools, principal of Fairbanks AK high school, US Navy lieutenant in WWII, superintendent of Logan Co OH schools, teacher at College of William and Mary, Exchange Program director in Pakistan, India and Egypt, and professor at Urbana College. He died 1 Feb 1982, age 74, buried Rushsylvania, Logan Co.

iv. Arthur Boyd⁵ “Duke” **Stanfield**, born 8 Jul 1909 Kenton OH, married Phyllis Eileen **Harrod**; two children. She was born 21 Jun 1922, daughter of John William Harrod and Cora Etta **Roebuck**.

Duke was a farmer and a veteran of WWII. During that war, Phyllis was the first female gas station attendant in Bellefontaine. She later worked a total of 44 years for the former Detroit Aluminum and Brass Company. Duke died 14 Jun 1976, age 66. Phyllis died

17 Aug 2001, age 79. They were buried Rushsylvania, Logan Co OH.

v. Lillian Marie⁵ **Stanfield**, born 11 Feb 1912 Logan Co OH, graduated from White Cross Hospital of Nursing in 1935. She married Oliver K "Andy" **Rosebrook**; daughter Helen Kathleen.

Born 12 Feb 1914, Andy died 11 Jan 1980, age 63. Lillian died 4 Dec 1982, age 70. They were buried Rushsylvania, Logan Co OH.

vi. Mary Louise⁵ **Stanfield**, born 14 Nov 1914, married Vaughn E **Ishee**, a veterinarian, in 1935; two children. He was born 12 Aug 1910. His parents were James Thomas Ishee and Ethel **Warner**.

Vaughn and Mary lived Middlefield, Geauga Co OH. She died 15 Feb 1976, age 61. He died 17 Oct 1978, age 68.

vii. Elizabeth Francis⁵ "Bette" **Stanfield**, born 1 Aug 1917, married Dick **Williamson** about 1940. He died about 1943. She married David Lawson **Eberhard** in 1944; two children. He was born 16 Jun 1915. His parents were Lloyd Melvin Eberhard and Gladys Berdella **Lawson**. Bette and David lived Rushsylvania, Logan Co OH, and also lived Geauga Co OH. Charles Lloyd, their younger son, was killed in an automobile accident at age 19. David died 1995, age about 80, buried Rushsylvania.

viii. Robert Lewis⁵ **Stanfield**, born 22 May 1919, married Betty Cathryn **Johnson** 22 Aug 1941; three children. She was born 23 Dec 1919. Her parents were Charles Stanley Johnson and Myrtia Augusta **Hatcher**. Robert was an agriculturalist, avid trap shooter and hunter, member of the Flying Farmers, and Board of Education president. He died 4 Aug 2001 Bellefontaine, Logan Co OH, age 82, buried Rushsylvania Cemetery.

ix. Donald Duerr⁵ **Stanfield** was born 12 Jun 1922. He was killed instantly 16 Nov 1929 in a hunting accident, shot by his Aunt Ernestine (sister-in-law of Clara Duerr Stanfield). Age 7, he was buried Rushsylvania Cemetery.

x. (--?--)⁵ **Stanfield** was not named. Stillborn 30 Nov 1925, she was buried Equality Cemetery, near Rushsylvania.

xi. a daughter⁵ **Stanfield**, born 5 May 1928, married 7 Oct 1946; three children. Her husband was born 14 Mar 1925 DeGraff, Miami Twp, Logan Co OH. He was a surgical technician in the army from 13 Jul 1943 to 24 Jan 1946. He served in many places in the Pacific, and was seriously wounded while trying to reach wounded soldiers in a landing on Leyte. He also survived having to abandon ship. He retired from farming and in 1985 was serving as a rural mail carrier.

g. Arthur Harold⁴ **Stanfield**, born 8 Jan 1880 Logan Co OH, married Molly "Millie" **Peoples**; at least one child. He died 13 May 1938, McKitrick Hospital, Kenton, Hardin Co OH, age 58, buried Preston Cemetery, Alger OH.

i. JoAnn⁵ "Joan" **Stanfield** married (--?--) **Meals**.

In 1880 they lived 2nd Ward, Lima, Allen Co OH, where he was a miller. She died 4 Mar 1891 Lima OH, age almost 57. He died 10 Sep 1909 Forest OH, age 72. They were buried Woodlawn Cemetery, Lima.

a. Samuel Brown⁴ **Douglass**, usually known as Brown, was born 29 Oct 1862. He married Mary May **Cunningham** 14 Oct 1886. Born 21 Nov 1864, she died 25 Feb 1927, age 62. Brown died 17 Jan 1944, age 81.

One son: Clarence John, who married Blanche **Neely**.

b. Joseph Boyd⁴ **Douglass**, usually known as Boyd, was born 27 Nov 1865. He married Carrie Emma **Smith** 25 Jun 1893. He died 31 Oct 1930, age 64.

c. Elizabeth Fay⁴ **Douglass**, usually known as Fay, was born 20 Oct 1867. She married Frank **Lafferty** 25 Jun 1905.

b. Annie Rebecca⁴ Badger was born 7 Jan 1849 three miles from Bellefontaine, Logan Co OH. She married **John Wesley Cole** 29 Jul 1869 Fort Madison IA. He was born 10 May 1843 Rumcreek OH. His parents were **Stephen Cole** and **Anna Magdalene Glick**.

John died 14 Sep 1923 DeGraff OH, age 80. Annie died 5 Apr 1926, age 77. They were buried Greenwood Cemetery, DeGraff, Logan Co OH.

Annie and John were parents of **Edith Avanelle Cole** (ECF), who married **Alexander Wadden Fisher** and became the grandmother of BFE. Annie and John also had a son who died as an infant.

ANNIE's NAME -- It was the custom to name the first son after the grandfather and the first daughter after the grandmother, so Annie Rebecca was originally named Rebecca Anne. ECF called her "Annie-mama".

WEDDING DRESS -- When Annie married John Wesley Cole in 1869, her dress was brown silk, with long full skirt worn over many skirts and hoops. The waist was tiny and close fitting, with "side bodies" (princess seams) on the back bodice, everything lined of course. She was 20 years old.

When Annie-mama had been married about three weeks, the heel of her shoe came off as she started downstairs. The front door was open and she landed on the front porch. A man saw her and ran to a livery stable, got a horse and buggy, and rushed to the depot, a mile away, to get her husband and bring him to her.

Her nose was laid over on her cheek. After they fixed her up, she got one hand loose and tore it all away, so they had to do it over again. She was hurt in other ways also, and was continually in pain the rest of her 77 years. Yet she worked hard and capably all her life. She liked to do things for "the other fellow". She was brilliant; people called her the "walking dictionary."

At the time Annie-mama and John were married in 1869, everything the family wore or ate had to be produced at home, except salt, white sugar, vanilla, spices and nutmeg, and oranges at Christmas. They had to knit the socks and make the clothes for everyone. Their relaxation, when they had time, was music, singing, embroidery, and patchwork for quilts. Also some wrote poetry, etc. and drew pictures.

c. Walter Ambrose⁴ **Badger**, usually known as Ambrose, was born 2 Jan 1851 near Bellefontaine, Logan Co OH. He married Emma Annabelle **Pool**, usually known as Annabelle; at least three children. She was born 1857. Her parents were William R Pool and Eleanor Barbara **Strayer**. Annabelle died 1914, age about 57, buried Greenwood Cemetery, Logan Co. In 1916 Ambrose and his children moved to Texas. He died there 10 Jan 1937, age 86,⁴ buried Greenwood.

We found their gravestones on our visit in 1998. This was the family CCF (Claire Cole Fisher) lived with for a while in Bellefontaine OH, with his grandparents Annie Rebecca Badger and John Wesley Cole. Ambrose signed the remembrance book as living in Barry IL. ECF said he was "a very lovable, good and kind Christian gentleman. He also was very gifted."

EMMA's FAMILY -- A tall monument in the Greenwood Cemetery is for her parents, William R Pool (20 Nov 1819 - 1 Apr 1902) and Eleanor B Pool (died 7 Jan 1874, age 51 yrs 2 mos).⁴ Engraving on one side commemorates their daughter Elizabeth M Pool, who died 21 Apr 1854, age four, and was interred in Mt Olive Chapel Cemetery.

There is an article about William and Eleanor in a Logan Co atlas, with illustrations of themselves and their farm. Eleanor's father was Rev Daniel Strayer of Miami Twp, Logan Co OH.

In the 1860 census, William and Eleanor are shown with six children in their household: Daniel, age 17; George, age 15; Benjamin, age 13; Isaac, age 9; Luther (?), age 7; and Annabell, age 3.

When Lena signed the remembrance book, she was living in Quincy OH. Earlier we weren't sure whether her name might actually be Laura, but we found her signature "Lena" on the 1913 petition. She is BFE's second cousin, once removed, and Lee is BFE's first cousin, twice removed, but they are not cousins of each other.

a) Elizabeth Miriam⁶ **Badger** married F T **Robidoux**; daughter Diane Elaine.

b) Dr William H⁶ **Badger**, born 2 Jul 1912, married Stella (Orella?) **Perry** 1934; one child. He died 1 Nov 1994 Houston TX, age 82.

i) Dr Lee William **Badger** II married Junye **Real**; sons Lee William III, Michael, and John.

ii. Edwin Jay⁵ **Badger**, born 1885, died unmarried 27 Feb 1941, age abt 56, buried Greenwood Cemetery.

iii. Ellen Cecil⁵ **Badger**, born 19 June 1888, wrote the notes mentioned on page 1. In 1948 she was living Houston TX with her brother and sister-in-law, Lee and Lena Badger, and their children. Ellen did not marry. She died 4 Feb 1976, age 87, buried Greenwood Cemetery.

1. John P Strayer, born 3 Jul 1796 Berkeley Co, married Rachel **Stewart** 6 Oct 1819; ten children. Born 9 Apr 1797, she died 10 Oct 1863, age 66. He married Jemima **Guerin**. He died 25 Sep 1877, Rumcreek area Logan Co OH, age 81, buried Hodge Cemetery.

a. Findlay Washington Strayer, born 25 Sep 1821 Middletown, Berkeley Co, married Mary Ann **Smith** 24 Dec 1846 Logan Co OH. Born 25 Jul 1826, she died 10 Feb 1863, age 41. He married Anna E **Loffer** 20 Dec 1863 Logan Co. Her parents were Solomon Teagarden Loffer and Susannah **Smith**. Findlay died 26 Oct 1896 Logan Co, age 75. Born 2 Aug 1838 Pickaway Co OH, Anna died 12 Aug 1932 Logan Co, age 92, buried Rea Cemetery, Pleasant Twp, Logan Co.

Four children, first marriage: John Wilson, Mary Ellen, Rose Anna, and Florence Jane.

Four children, second marriage: Francis E, William Edward, Elmer/Elma E, and Jesse E.

i. John Wilson Strayer, born about 1850, married Sarah Louise **Johnston** 5 Jun 1873; seven children. He died 9 Mar 1923, age about 73, buried DeGraff Cemetery, Logan Co.

a) Charles Otto Strayer, born 15 Jun 1874 Logan Co, married Estella [Strayer] Jun 1900; two children. She was born 6 Sep 1874. He died 3 May 1919 Logan Co, age 44. In 1920 she was living Bellefontaine OH with son Frank L, age 4½, daughter Helen [**Fridley**], age 18, a telephone operator, and son-in-law Isaac Grover Fridley, age 24, a laborer.

Note, our information in earlier issuances of All-People was incorrect. We had confused *Estella, wife of Charles Otto Strayer, with Stella Cole, wife of William Edward Strayer, below.*

ii. William Edward Strayer, born Apr 1858, married Anna Estella "Stella" **Cole** about 1899; four children. She was born 17 Mar 1870 Bloomfield Twp, Logan Co OH. Her parents were Joseph Wilson Cole and Lucy **Foulk**, Section 6b. William died about 1942 Logan Co, age about 84. Stella signed Annie Rebecca's remembrance book 27 Aug 1892, Bloom Centre OH. In 1954 Stella was living near DeGraff, Logan Co.

B. John Strayer, born 9 Dec 1765 York Co PA, married Anna Maria [Strayer] 1780-1785; five children. Born 1766 Philadelphia, she died 1796-1797 Berkeley Co VA, age about 30. He married Priscilla **Wood** 11 Jan 1798; seven children. Born 12 Apr 1877 Frederick Co MD, she died 1820-1823 Hocking Twp, Fairfield Co OH, age about 43. He married Martha **Thompson** 13 Apr 1826. He died 23 Nov 1831 Hocking Twp, age 75. Born in PA, she died >1850.

1. Rev Daniel Strayer, born 23 Jan 1790 Berkeley Co, married Virginia Elizabeth **Small** 8 Mar 1815; five children. Her parents were Jacob Small and Barbara **Couchman**. Born 8 Feb 1788 in VA, Virginia died 17 May 1864 Logan Co OH, age 76. Daniel died 27 Mar 1869, age 79. They buried Olive Chapel Cem, Logan Co.

a. Eleanor Barbara Strayer, born 7 Nov 1822¹¹ (or 7 Oct 1823), married William R **Pool** 19 Feb 1843 Logan Co OH. He was born 20 Nov 1819 Shelby Co OH, son of George Robert Pool and Mary **Wilkinson**. Eleanor died 7 Jan 1874 DeGraff, Logan Co, age 51. William died 1 Apr 1902 Bellefontaine, Logan Co, age 82. They were buried Greenwood Cemetery, Pleasant Twp, Logan Co.

Seven children: Daniel Strayer (11 Dec 1843 - 1 Mar 1921); George Thomas (18 Sep 1845 - 20 Jan 1925); Benjamin W (Jan 1848 - c 1944); Mary Elizabeth (4 Dec 1849 - 21 Apr 1854); Isaac A (c 1853 - c 1898); Luther H (Jun 1854 - c 1934); and Emma Annabelle (below).

e. Oscar Eugene⁴ **Badger**, born 29 May 1855, married Jennie **Miller**; at least five children. She was born in IL about 1863 (age 57 in 1920, Bowling Green, Washington Twp, Clay Co IN). Her father was born in IL, and her mother in NY.

ECF said both Oscar and Jennie were Methodist ministers. About 1953, ECF said he was living Indiana (age 98?).

She also said one of Oscar's sons died in the US from "a disease contracted while serving US in a foreign country as an educator". We aren't sure whether this was Winfield or Glenn.

i. Charlotte⁵ "Lottie" **Badger** "died when a very young lady".

ii. Glenn⁵ **Badger** worked with government education in Washington DC.

iii. Charles⁵ **Badger** lived in California.

iv. Robert⁵ **Badger**, born about 1894 (age 35 in 1934), married Ruth E [Badger]; four children. She was born about 1897 (age 32 in 1930).

A Methodist minister, Robert was district superintendent of the Methodist Episcopal Church in Rushville IN.

a) Ruth E⁵ **Badger**, born about 1918 (age 12 in 1930), married a weather forecaster in the US Weather Bureau, Seattle WA.

b) Martha E⁵ **Badger**, born about 1920 (age 10 in 1930), was a social worker in the Denver CO school system.

ECF said Martha was offered the position of Director of Christian Education in her church, but thought her educational qualifications were more suited to social work.

c) Priscilla H⁵ **Badger**, born about 1926 (age 4 in 1930), may have died young.

d) Philip K⁵ **Badger**, born about 1928 (age 2 in 1930), may have died young.

v. Winfield⁴ **Badger** was a Methodist minister.

f. Eliza Jane⁴ "Jennie" **Badger**, born 17 May 1859, married James Wesley **Poland** (usually known as Wesley) 25 Oct 1882 Carrollton MO; three children born in MO. On the same day, after the wedding was over, they (with her sister Annie and her husband and daughter) moved to Lincoln NE.

Wesley was born Dec 1855 (age 45 in 1900, 64 in 1920 census of Cameron City, Clinton Co MO). In the household with them in 1920 was son Ross, age 29. In the next household was son J Foster and his wife.

ECF said "John and Annie Cole made a big wedding for Jennie and Wesley Poland. Of course, Grandma Eliza helped. I was a little girl and I had a gorgeous time watching the cakes being prepared and 'licking the crocks'. They were making cakes for days and used the home oven and the neighbor's oven. It seemed to me nearly everyone in town was there at the wedding. O, I had a wonderful time!"

Wesley Poland had become John Cole's partner in the hardware store in Carrollton MO before the wedding. Wesley and Jennie moved, probably by 1890, from Lincoln NE to Cameron MO, where Wesley became the mayor.

Rev JH Poland and Ollie D Poland signed the remembrance book as cousins, living in Luray, Clark Co MO. We believe "Ref JH" was Wesley's older brother, Rev John H Poland. ECF said John's wife Ollie was a cousin of John Wesley Cole, but we haven't been able to identify her parents.

We also have names of Eva Cole Poland (1847-1922) and George B Poland (1847-1916), buried Graceland Cemetery, Sidney OH. We wonder if George could have been a brother of Wesley Poland, but haven't been able to identify them for certain.

i. Muriel⁵ (or Iva Myrl) **Poland** was born Mar 1884 (age 16 in 1900).

ii. Roswell⁵ "Ross" **Poland** was born Nov 1890 in MO (age 9 in 1900). An aviator, he died soon after WWI.

iii. James Foster⁵ **Poland**, usually known as Foster, was born Oct 1892 in MO (age 7 in 1900). He married Pearl [Poland] about 1916. He "went to war in France". In 1920 he was shown as age 27, with wife Pearl age 25, born in MO. He became an undertaker in Cameron MO. He married Dorothy **Cruse** about 1923.

Three children shown in 1930 census: Robert Foster, James Roswell, and Richard G.

g. Edith Ivaloo⁴ "Iva" **Badger**, born 16 Mar 1864, married William H **Trenchard** 1 Jan 1889; at least five children. He was born about 1859 in IL (age 61 in 1920). His father was born in NY and his mother was born Limerick, Ireland. Iva probably died about 1953, age about 89.

ECF said William was a farmer and quite wealthy. He and Iva were married at the home of John Wesley Cole and Annie Rebecca Badger, Lincoln NE. ECF said John Cole Flemming was best man and she (ECF) was bridesmaid.

In Mar 1902 Iva came to visit ECF from Boone IA, so we believe that Iva and William were living Boone IA at that time, and that her mother Eliza Jane was living with them.

In 1920 Iva and William were living Hardin City, Crooked River Twp, Ray Co MO. In the household with them were their daughter Wilma and son Leonard. In the same Enumeration District were their son Oliver and his wife Ona.

- i.** Miriam Edna⁵ **Trenchard** married Marshall **Yetter** Oct 1916; two children: Ivaloo and William.
- ii.** Glenda (Glada?) Avanel⁵ **Trenchard** married Victor **Lockhart**; two sons, John Irving and one other.
- iii.** Wilma L⁵ **Trenchard** was born about 1896 in IA (age 24 in 1920). She did not marry; taught high school in Kansas City MO many years. She was living with her mother Kansas City MO in 1948.
- iv.** Oliver⁵ **Trenchard**, a farmer, was born about 1898 in IA (age 22 in 1920). He married Ona D [Trenchard]. She was born about 1897 in MO (age 23 in 1920).
One daughter: Dorothy Marilyn, born 1 Feb 1927 Hardin MO.
- v.** Leonard Ambrose⁵ **Trenchard** was born about 1900 in IA (age 20 in 1920). He married Ethel (Lucile?) [Trenchard]; no children.
