Note 2: Unless otherwise indicated, much of the information in this Section is from Robert L Souweine of Maywood IL, who has collected a great deal of interesting material about the family. His work on the older generations is based in large part on “Souweine Family Record” by Arthur J Souweine of Brooklyn NY, self published in 1907. We wish we had space to tell more.

Note 3: Names of direct ancestors of the grandchildren of Edward Leo Souweine and Katherine Rita McDermott are underlined.

I. Emmanuel¹ (Israel?) Souweine was born about 1755 Schweinheim, Bas-Rhin (Alsace), France. We believe his parents were Emmanuel Israel and Flora Cerf (Serff?).

Emmanuel Souweine married Adrienne Gertrude Phillip (Pfeifer?) probably about 1788; at least seven children. She was born Mulhouse, Haut-Rhin (Alsace), possibly about 1768.

They lived Brussels, Belgium, until they moved to Ghent, East Flanders, Belgium, about 1797 (or 1800). He died about 1840 Brussels, age 85, and she died there about 1843, age possibly about 75.

SCHWEINHEIM was changed in 1953 to Schwenheim. It’s about 25 km NW of the center of Strasbourg, which is now the capital city of the Bas-Rhin department in France, but was an independent city at the time Emmanuel was born. Incidentally, the *Marseillaise* was composed and first sung in Strasbourg.

ALSACE changed hands and boundaries several times and is now one of France’s regions (areas without political boundaries but commonly understood, comparable to “New England” in the US).

In most cases, we’ve given up trying to determine exact geographical terminology applicable to the time periods of the events concerned; and are mostly using present-day terms. We hope this helps readers find the locations on modern maps. We recommend further research into the fascinating history of these regions.

SURNAMES – People didn’t have surnames, in the sense we do today, until a few hundred years ago. They were known by what we think of as their first names. To distinguish one from another with the same name, sometimes a descriptive word or phrase was added – for example, occupation, place of residence, or a personal characteristic. Those additional identifying words evolved into surnames, sometimes transforming along the way. Pronunciations and spellings changed gradually, creating the vast variety we have today.

Eventually official surnames were required, but the timing of this varied from country to country and their various subdivisions. We don’t know when our family began to use, informally, what might be thought of as a surname, but we believe that some variations, including **Chueiner**, may have been used at least occasionally.

SOUWEINE – We don’t know, with any certainty, the origins of the name Souweine, but one theory holds that it derived from the place-name Schweinheim (literally Pigs’ Home). It should be kept in mind that the time period when the name Souweine was formally established was around the time of the French Revolution as well as the relocation of much, if not all, of the family from France to Belgium.

We’ve found that, during this period, many Jews had purposely degrading surnames foisted upon them, such as Eselkopf (similar in meaning to the well-known Dumkopf). Obviously, it’s a possibility that any surname derived from Schweinheim could have such a connotation.

We believe our family used Souweine as their official surname after an Imperial decree of 17 Mar 1808 which required all Jews to register. We found listings¹ of those residing in Ghent, at least one of which appears to indicate that our family was allowed to “retain” the name Souweine, so they must have been using that name before 1808. We don’t know all the details of these events, and some of our findings are confusing. We hope future researchers will find it an interesting subject to pursue.

SPELLINGS – Throughout our work on *All-People*, we have learned that placing too much reliance on spelling can be very misleading. During the centuries before literacy became almost universal, names were spelled however they sounded to the person recording them. In another Section, we found a name spelled three different ways in a single document!

In addition, spellings in and near Belgium can also be a little confusing because of the languages. Generally, the people speak either Flemish or French, but some German and Dutch are also used, plus various local dialects. We’ve tried to spell names of people and places appropriately, apologize for the errors we surely have made, and request our spellings not be passed along to others without warning of probable inaccuracies.

A. Israel (Joseph?)² Souweine was born 1790-1791 Brussels. A Napoleonic soldier, in 1810 he served in Russia. He married Jeannette **Hermen** about 1816; six children. She was born about 1797. He died about 1848, age about 58.

1. Nathalie³ **Souweine** was born about 1817 Ghent.
2. Flora³ **Souweine** was born about 1819 Ghent.
3. Herman³ **Souweine** was born about 1821 Ghent. He died about 1856 Brussels, age about 37.
4. Victoire³ **Souweine**, born about 1823 Luxembourg, married Isidore **Souweine** – see page 19-4.
5. Marianne³ **Souweine**, born about 1826 Luxembourg, married (–?) **Oberdorf**.
6. Emmanuel³ **Souweine** was born about 1833 Luxembourg.

B. Charles² Souweine, born 30 Apr 1793 Brussels, married **Catherine De Macum** about 1813; eight children born Ghent. Born about 1789, she died about 1841 Ghent, age about 52. He died about 1867, age about 74.

1. Moise³ **Souweine** was born about 1814. He died about 1816, age about two.
2. Nathalie³ **Souweine**, born about 1816, married Napoleon **Rinskopf** about 1837. Born about 1810, he died about 1883, age about 73.
3. Marianne³ **Souweine**, born about 1818, married Leon **Maisonpierre** about 1866. Born about 1835, he died about 1890, age about 55.
4. Philippe³ Souweine, born about 1821, married Fannie Souweine – see page 19-7.
5. Charles³ “Isadore” **Souweine**, born about 1823, married Virginie **Coulon**. Born about 1825, she died about 1891, age about 66.
6. Cerf Charles³ “Joseph” **Souweine**, born about 1825, married Jeanne **Chaboz** and Charlotte **Assers**.
7. Benoit³ **Souweine**, born about 1828, married Melanie **Landa** about 1865.
8. Therese³ **Souweine**, born about 1832, married Henri **Franck** about 1863.

C. Guillaume² Souweine, born about 1795 Brussels, married **Caroline Alfenne** – see page 19-4.

D. Antoinette/Annette² **Souweine**, born about 1797 Dunkerque,² married Abraham **Rosenbaum** about 1813. Born about 1770, he died about 1816, age about 46.

She married Jacob **van Dantzig**. Born about 1795, he died about 1878, age 83.

E. Catharine² “Frieda” **Souweine** was born about 1800 Ghent. She died about 1878 Paris, age about 78.

F. Herman (Jacob?)² **Souweine**, born about 1802 Ghent, married Therese **Herman** about 1825. He died about 1846 Limont, age about 44. Born about 1805, she died about 1884, age about 79.

Gerald Souweine, mentioned below in the paragraph about the Holocaust, was their great-great-grandson.

G. Emmanuel Cerf² **Souweine** was born about 1804 Ghent. In 1808 Emmanuel was added to his name, and his former first name Cerf became his middle name.²

He married Helene **Hellendal** 21 Jul 1825 Maastricht, Limburg, Netherlands; at least two children. Born about 1809, she died about 1836, age about 27.

Secondly, he married Rosa **Horn** 30 Mar 1836 Sittard, Limburg, Netherlands; no children known to us. Born about 1813, she died about 1869, age 56. He died 24 Feb 1882 Sittard, age about 78.

1. Isadore/Isidoor/Isidor³ **Souweine**, a koopman (businessman or merchant), was born 2 Aug 1826 Maastricht. He married Sabilla **Horn** 10 Dec 1858; nine children born Sittard.

He died 21 Jan 1903, age 76. Born about 1834, she died about 1912, age about 78.

a. Rosalie⁴ **Souweine**, born 4 Sep 1859, married Karel **Hertzdahl** 3 Nov 1886; five children. She married Adolph **Wolff** (age 26) 3 Sep 1900; two children. She died 31 Jan 1939, age 80.

THE HOLOCAUST – At least three of Rosalie’s children, born Sittard, died Auschwitz:⁸

Salomon Victor **Hertzdahl**, born 3 Aug 1887, murdered 30 Sep 1942, age 55.

Haijman Silvain **Hertzdahl**, born 2 Sep 1890, murdered 22 Apr 1943, age 52.

Isidore George **Wolff**, born 22 Sep 1903, murdered 1942/45, age about 40.

Another cousin, Gerald **Souweine**, was only 15 or 16 when he was killed there.¹⁰

We also found several members of our family who died Sobibór Extermination Camp, Poland. No doubt there were more, who had remained in Europe when other relatives emigrated, and were murdered in various locations. Perhaps a future researcher might try to memorialize them.

In 1970 some of our family visited Dachau, and we cannot even try to describe that place.

b. Julie⁴ **Souweine**, born Feb 1861, married Michel **Wesly**; three children. Secondly, she married Isaak **Sternveld**. She died 6 Jul 1934, age about 73.

c. Emile⁴ **Souweine** was born 6 Sep 1862.

d. Cesar Isador⁴ **Souweine** was born 7 Mar 1865. He died 18 May 1867, age two.

e. Caroline⁴ **Souweine** was born Sep 1866.

f. Wilhelmina⁴ **Souweine** was born 5 Nov 1868.

g. Henri Cerf⁴ **Souweine** was born about 1870.

h. Sophia⁴ **Souweine** was born 26 Nov 1871. She died 18 Dec 1941, age 70.

i. Felix Isador⁴ **Souweine** was born 30 Nov 1873.

C. Guillaume² Souweine, born about 1795 Brussels, Belgium, married **Caroline Alfenne** about 1817. She was born about 1795. Her parents were **Isaac Alfenne** and possibly **Wilhelmina Hellendal**, who also had daughters Victoire, Adelaide, and Emilie.⁶

Caroline died about 1843, age about 48. Guillaume died 11 Dec 1878 Brussels, age about 83.

1. Celestine³ Souweine, born 6 Jun 1818 Ghent, Belgium, married David **Meyer** 16 Dec 1834; six children. In 1910 she was living 116th Street, Manhattan NY, with her daughter Frances, *below*, and her niece Carolyn, *page 19-5*. Celestine died 15 Feb 1913, age 94, probably in Manhattan.

a. Euphrosine⁴ Meyer, born 15 May 1836, married Adolphe **Rosenthal** 17 Jun 1856; five children: Clementine, Eugenie, Edmond, Caroline, and Louise. Euphrosine died 15 Sep 1912, age 56.

b. Frances⁴ Meyer was born 3 Aug 1838. In 1910 she was living with her mother and her cousin Carolyn. Frances died 17 Aug 1912, age 74.

c. Bella⁴ Meyer, born 16 Feb 1840, married Louis **Schloss** 26 Mar 1871; four children: Joseph J, Arthur, Emil, and Dina.

d. Jules⁴ Meyer, born 28 Nov 1842, married Jeanne **Rosenbaum** 19 Jan 1872; two children: Albert P and Lea. Jules died 11 Oct 1918, age 75.

e. Caroline⁴ Meyer, born 9 May 1847 Brussels, married Louis **Apt** 8 Dec 1878; two children. She died 2 Apr 1910, age 62.

i. Celestine⁵ Apt, born 4 Oct 1881 Brooklyn NY, married her first cousin (once removed) Arthur Jacob **Souweine** 8 Nov 1908. His parents were Adolphe Souweine and Susan **Van Raalte** – *see page 19-6*.

ii. Leah⁵ “Lillie” Apt, born 3 Feb 1883 Brooklyn NY, married Morris **Heilbrunn** 28 Jun 1908. Morris was born about 1878. Two children: Lewis Sylvan (9 Apr 1912) and Sydney Charles (5 May 1915).

f. Arthur⁴ Meyer, born 6 Jan 1852, married Camille **Guillaume** 20 Mar 1884. He died 10 Jun 1903, age 51.

2. (Israel?) Guillaume³ “Isidore” Souweine, born 2 Jul 1820 Ghent, Belgium, married his first cousin Victoire **Souweine** 29 Aug 1852; eight children. She was born about 1823 Luxembourg, daughter of Israel (Joseph?) Souweine and Jeannette **Hermen**, *page 19-2*. In 1880 Isidore was a bookkeeper living Brooklyn NY. She died about 1897, age about 74; he died 8 Feb 1905, age 84.

a. Julien⁴ Souweine was born and died about 1853 Brussels.

b. Albert⁴ Souweine was born 2 Aug 1854. He died 5 Dec 1876, age 22.

c. Victor Charles⁴ Souweine, born 24 Jan 1856, married Kath Marie **Trautmann**; three children. He died 22 Feb 1925; age 69.

- d. Caroline⁴ **Souweine** was born 28 Nov 1857 New York NY. She died 19 Dec 1859, age two.
- e. Hortense⁴ **Souweine**, born 4 Nov 1859, married Samuel **Spitz**; two children: Rose and Jeanne. Hortense died 12 Aug 1929, age 69.
- f. Leon⁴ **Souweine**, born 5 Oct 1861, married Anna **Wagner** 28 May 1891; five children: Ruth C, Victoire F, Hortense F, Isadore W, and Marion. Leon, in 1910 a printer in Brooklyn, died 2 Feb 1938, age 76.
- g. Adrienne⁴ **Souweine** was born 21 May 1864. She died 18 Aug 1865, age one.
- h. Flora⁴ **Souweine**, born 11 Jul 1866 Brooklyn NY, married Myer **Phillips** 4 Sep 1887; two children: Evelyn Carrie and Louis Albert. Flora died 19 Sep 1951, age 85.
3. Marcus³ **Souweine** was born Apr 1822 Ghent, Belgium. He died Jan 1865, age 42.
4. Felix J³ **Souweine**, born 8 Oct 1824 Ghent, married Hannah **Van Raalte** 10 Aug 1848; two children. She may have been a sister of Susan Van Raalte, who married Felix's younger brother Adolphe. In 1880 Felix was an upholsterer Manhattan NY. He died 10 Oct 1906, age 82.
- We would like to know more about Hannah and Susan, and why they and their husbands were in London when their children were born. Many men of the family were merchants; perhaps Felix and Adolphe may have been there in connection with business.
- a. Carolyn **Souweine** was born 16 Nov 1851 London, England. In 1910 she was living Manhattan NY with her grandaunt Celestine and her cousin Frances, *page 19-4*.
- b. Joseph George **Souweine** was born 2 Mar 1857, probably in London. He married Fanny **Hanauer** 27 Apr 1884; two children: Hattie (married J C **Campbell**), and Louis (married Hannah **Sperl**).
5. Silvain³ **Souweine**, born 18 Apr 1828 Ghent, married Nathalie **De Fries** 11 May 1857; five children. Born about 1836, she died about 1905, age about 69. He died about 1914, age about 86.
- a. Albert⁴ **Souweine**, born Ghent 6 Dec 1858, married Isabelle **Hartog** 10 Feb 1886; three children.
- b. Oscar⁴ **Souweine**, born 1 Jan 1862, married Celestine **Salomon** 14 Dec 1887.
- c. Marcel⁴ **Souweine**, born 17 Feb 1864, married Elmire Josephine **De Smedt** 1 Sep 1892.
- d. Caroline⁴ **Souweine**, born 28 Aug 1866 Brussels, married Francois **de Libouton** 10 Nov 1891.
- e. Adrienne⁴ **Souweine**, born 2 Dec 1870, married Georges **Souweine** 12 Jun 1895.
6. Fannie³ **Souweine**, born 30 Aug 1830 Maastricht, Limburg, Netherlands, married her first cousin Philippe **Souweine** 16 Dec 1850. His parents were Charles **Souweine** and Catherine **De Macum** – *see page 19-7*.
7. Adolphe³ **Souweine**, born 2 Jul 1832 Maastricht, married Susan **Van Raalte** 15 Sep 1856; two children. She may have been a sister of Hannah Van Raalte, who married Adolphe's brother Felix. Adolphe died 3 Jun 1907, age 74.
- a. Emanuel⁴ **Souweine**, born 10 Oct 1857 London, England, married Catherine Conrad **Shute** 18 Apr 1889; no children known to us. He was active in the deaf community of New York. Born about 1859, she died about 1922, age about 63. He died Jan 1942, age 84.

b. Arthur Jacob⁴ **Souweine**, born 25 Dec 1872 New York NY, married his first cousin (once removed) Celestine **Apt** 8 Nov 1908; one child. She was born 24 Oct 1881 Brooklyn NY. Her parents were Louis Apt and Caroline **Meyer**, *page 19-4*.

Arthur died 28 Nov 1851, age 76. Celestine died Oct 1965, age 83.

In 1907 Arthur published his book, the *Souweine Family Record*, which has been the major source of information for the earlier generations in this Section of *All-People*. He had researched extensively and written about the family for several years. We are grateful for his work and for his effort in making it available in book form.

He was also very interested in chess and involved in tournaments. At least one of his games, against a future world champion, was described and published in a chess magazine.

4. Philippe³ Souweine, born 26 Feb 1821 Ghent, Belgium, was a tailor or possibly a garment cutter. He immigrated to America probably about 1840. He married his first cousin Fannie Souweine 16 Dec 1850; eleven children.

She was born 30 Aug 1830. Her parents were Guillaume Souweine and Caroline Alfenne, *page 19-4*. Fannie died 13 Aug 1895, age 65. Philippe died 4 Jun 1902 in NY, age 81.

a. Theophile Emanuel Charles Guillaume⁴ Souweine, a cutter at a wholesale clothing company, was born 14 Jun 1852 Brussels. He married Esther Gotthelf 11 May 1879; four children. Her parents were Leopold Gotthelf and Caroline [Gotthelf]. Theophile and Esther immigrated to America before 1881. He died 19 Dec 1926 Brooklyn, Kings Co NY, age 74.

In the 1910 census of the 18th ward, Brooklyn, Theophile's household includes sons Leopold (27) and Joseph (23), daughter Edna (29) and son-in-law Louis Rosenberg (34, married 5 years), daughter Carrie (25), and niece Grace D Shane (26, not identified by us).

In the 1930 census, Esther (widow) and Louis lived in owned homes next to each other.

a) Bernice⁶ **Rosenberg** was born and died about 1907.

ii. Leopold⁵ “Leo” Souweine was born 10 Jan 1883 New York NY. In 1900 and 1910 he was a bookkeeper, in 1920 an auditor at a railway company, and in 1930 a furniture salesman. He died 18 Feb 1938, age 55.

iii. Caroline Eugenia⁵ “Carrie” Souweine was born 10 Sep 1884 New York NY. She married Theodore **Hanau** 20 Mar 1918; one child. She died 3 Oct 1966, age 82.

a) Robert⁶ **Hanau** was born 29 Jun 1920.

iv. Joseph Charles⁵ Souweine was born 7 Jan 1887 Brooklyn, Kings Co NY. In 1910 he was a clerk at the Railway Steel Spring Company. After serving in WWI, he married Maude Edna Trope 26 Nov 1919; one child. She was born 21 Mar 1890. Her parents were William Trope and Mary Susan CAGE

- f.** Henry Eugene⁴ **Souweine** was born 4 Feb 1863 New York. He died 22 Feb 1863, age 18 days.

A. Paul² Busey Jr, probably born before 1664, was a planter in Prince George's Co MD. He married Sara Whipps. Her father was John Whipps. Paul Jr died Oct 1718 Prince George's Co. Nine children: Paul III, John, Charles, Sarah, Susannah, Samuel, Edward (below), Anne, Joshua.

7. Edward³ Busey was born about 1709. He was a carpenter, living from 1738 on 100 acre "Joseph Park" in Prince George's Co MD, and from Oct 1748 on 100 acre "Walnut Plains" in the part of Frederick Co MD which later became part of Montgomery Co MD. He married Sarah [Busey]. He died about 1778 Frederick Co, age about 69.

At least seven children: Mary, Charles, Paul, Henry (below), Edward, Samuel, Benjamin.

d. Henry⁴ Busey, born Aug 1747 in MD, married Ann Trueman 13 Oct 1778 Frederick Co MD; four children. Secondly, he married Ann **Macattee** 11 Aug 1792 Frederick Co; four children. He died 2 Feb 1836 Jefferson Co VA, age 88.

Note: in 1863 the state of West Virginia was created from fifty counties in Virginia, including Jefferson and Berkeley.

Note also: the surname of Henry Busey's wife Ann was spelled various ways. See our remarks about spellings on page 19-1.

i. Washington G⁵ (George?) Busey was born 9 Aug 1779. He married Elizabeth **Read** 4 Oct 1809, married Sarah **Brown** 16 Dec 1831, and married Elizabeth Allison **Avis** 30 Jun 1836; children not known to us.

ii. Benjamin Trueman⁵ Busey, born about 1784, married Mary Walper 14 Aug 1817 Berkeley Co VA; seven children. She was born 13 Apr 1789. Her parents were Casper Walper and Mary Sprinkle, page 19-12.

Benjamin died Sep 1839, age about 55. Mary Walper died 18 Jul 1872 Martinsburg, Berkeley Co WV, age 83.

Mary Walper probably first married Nicholas **Rousch** 21 Aug 1806 Jefferson Co VA; children not known to us.

9. Daniel³ **Sprenckel**, also known as **Sprenkle**, was born about 1744 York Co. He married Christina **Myers**. He died 11 Jun 1821 Adams Co PA, age about 87.

11. Anna Maria³ **Sprenckel** was born 22 Apr 1749 York Co.
12. John Jacob³ **Sprenckel**, born 8 Feb 1751 York Co, married Barbara **Lang**. He died 1805-1810 Fayette Co KY, age about 56-61.

ED SOUWEINE

An only child, much loved by his parents, Ed attended Public School 108 and John Adams High School. He attended St John's University in Queens, until he won a scholarship to George Washington University in Washington DC. He was a member of an Honor Mathematics Fraternity there, and graduated 1941, age 20.

He and Rita met briefly as teenagers at a barn dance at the church where they later married. He worked for Benton and Bowles Advertising Agency, and joined the Navy after Pearl Harbor. Called to active duty on 4 Jul 1942, he was assigned to Officers' Training School, at Notre Dame University and on an old vessel *Prairie State*. After 90 days he was commissioned as an Ensign. He and Rita became engaged 11 Dec 1942.

His first assignment as an officer was on the *USS Andromeda (AKA-15)*,⁷ based in North Africa, on which he served in the invasions of Sicily and Salerno. After about a year, he and Rita married 8 Jan 1944 and had a three-day honeymoon in New York. They were able to be together for three months while he was in further training.

He was transferred to the *USS Alshain (AKA-55)*,⁷ and the ship was sent to the South Pacific, where he participated in five engagements, including Leyte and the Lingayan Gulf. At the end of the war, in Okinawa while awaiting transport home, he survived a typhoon in a tent on the beach. He was discharged as a Lieutenant (Junior Grade). He reached home Nov 1945, and for some years remained in the Naval Reserve.

He became a detail man in Manhattan, for Simon and Schuster's Pocket Books and Golden Books. When the firm downsized, he was hired at the Unemployment Office until his former job was restored. Ed and Rita lived with his parents in a two-family house.

In 1947 they rented a house in Levittown, Long Island, and in 1949 purchased a ranch house. He was a time study analyst at Republic Aircraft. Then he started his career at the Social Security Administration, in several field offices in the New York area. Later he transferred to the National Office in the Baltimore MD area, and about 1962 they bought a house in Bowie MD. In 1978 they bought the house Rita (2009) still lives in.

Much involved in the community, Ed and Rita started PTAs at the Kenilworth Elementary School and Belair Junior High, and helped with one at Bowie Senior High. Ed was also President of the Belair Recreation Council, coached a boys' baseball team, and for two years was in a regional humorous musical "Hello Leavitt".

Very active after retirement, he continued with his many interests, which included genealogy, geography, history, crossword puzzles, and cooking dinner. Surgery in 1984 for a meningioma brain tumor resulted in paralysis of his left side, but he never let this stop him from enjoying life and his family. He was a remarkable person, missed by many relatives and friends.
